Proud family members were on hand to see the participants receive their certificates presented by Beverley Litster, Area Manager Training & Skills for DD&SW region for DET.

Under the Skilling Queenslanders for Work (SQW) initiative which is funded by the State Government, these programs provide tailored support to a diverse range of target groups in a community-based setting and most importantly, SQW is not a one size fits all model that is rolled out across the state.

GTT Executive Officer Esme Cairns explained to the gathering the importance of the work GTT does in the community in a varied and wide-ranging area and that the strength of these government funded programs helps so many Queenslanders back into work or training.

SQW allows community-based organisations like GTT to deliver flexible programs that are responsive to local needs. The Get Set for Work program delivers intensive employment and training assistance to 15-19 year olds to help them transition to the workforce, undertake further education and training or return to school.

Steady, Ready, Go is a community work skills project that delivers assistance to people of all ages to gain nationally-recognised skills and qualifications.
